



President's Message

Welcome to another AGM of the PHT.

Trying to review events and activities over the last year has been a daunting task; even as president, I am amazed at quantity, variety and quality of the work that must have been put in to achieve this. Thanks once again to our dedicated staff, members and volunteer supporters and not least the many sponsors whose funds have made this possible.

Creating greater Public Awareness and Support

For a long time, PHT has concentrated on increasing awareness amongst stakeholders in the city as well as building up the management capacity of policy-makers and administrators.

This process continues through our busy programmes of public talks, heritage tours, technical workshops and academic conferences. Significant contributions have also been made by individual members of the trust through publications, statements and restoration project to support our confidence in the future of our heritage.

Previous criticisms of elitism are being addressed as we try to reach out to almost all relevant stakeholders, residents, landlords, tradesmen, cultural and clan associations, and local religious councils down to school and college students. The wide newspaper coverage of our views and activities show that our base of support is broadening though more needs to be done.

We believe that public opinion is not sufficiently supportive to provide a soft 'political landing' for the introduction of firmer and more comprehensive conservation policies; unfortunately, the state government is still hesitant fearing a political backlash.

Links with other Organisations

In the quest for Georgetown's heritage, PHT continues to strengthen important links with other organisations. UNESCO, under its Cultural Advisor Dr. Englehardt, has been playing key role supporting and guiding Penang's efforts for inscription on UNESCO's World Heritage List. PHT is part of a tripartite team working together with the Penang State Government to achieve this long term goal.

Badan Warisan Malaysia, as the national conservation NGO under it's President Tan Sri Ahmad Sarji, shares our concerns and we continue to support each other and we consult and seek their advice especially on Federal Legislation.

PHT and the Government

Although the PHT appreciates that Tan Sri Dr. Koh as the first Penang Chief Minister seriously committed to a state conservation policy, unfortunately, its effectiveness is seriously hampered by the poor response of the Federal and Local authorities e.g., in appropriate funding, legislation and planning approvals. The

State Heritage Conservation Committee under the CM (comprising State Executive Council members, administrators, private consultants, NGOs including the PHT) has not achieved the results anticipated at its inception 6 years ago. While inappropriate building plans are still being passed, genuine efforts in heritage development continue to face discouraging obstacles from obsolete regulations and inflexible bureaucratic attitudes.

Equally disappointing are certain government-funded restorations of their own properties. The Syed Alatas Mansion, restored as an example of international co-operation has been subverted from its original purpose as a conservation centre and is now temporarily unoccupied. Suffolk House, already partially restored with PHT and Federal funds remains incomplete despite potential corporate sponsorship awaiting token government support. And, finally, Fort Cornwallis recently restored by Muzium Negara, remains neglected without a management plan for adaptive reuse. We hope the current restoration of the Town Hall will meet with a better fate.

Threats to the PHT

Within the PHT, we are threatened with organisational fatigue, needing fresh transfusion in leadership and activists urgently. Larger premises are desperately needed and the PHT council continues its search for new home to be restored under AMEX/World Monuments Fund. With our over stretched organisation committed to so many projects/activities, the new council might start to consider narrowing our focus in future.

The Future of George Town?

The State Government administration continues to face major obstacles in

pursuing a conservation policy; these obstacles must be quickly cleared before we lose more of our cultural and architectural heritage. It must recognise the long-term economic and cultural value of conservation against the ad-hoc, short-term policies demanded by the anti-heritage lobby, looking for quick profits. The government must also realise that major financial investments and long-term planning are essential before we can to reap these benefits. There is already so much recognition of George Town's priceless heritage assets by international experts that it is inexcusable for any government today to neglect it on the excuse of ignorance.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2002

Sunday, 29 September 2002 3.00 pm Nanyang Chinese Cuisine,

164 Jalan Masjid Kapitan Keling, 10200 Penang

1. Chairman Welcoming Address

The President, Dr Choong welcomed the members present and called the meeting to order at 3.20pm. He thanked members for their support and made a few announcements in the meeting. He invited members to join the short site visit after the AGM. He also reminded members to renew their membership and announced that those who have not paid up their subscriptions for year 2001 would be deleted from the membership list after the AGM.

Dr Choong informed that the American Express Foundation has, through the World Monuments Watch programme, approved a grant for PHT to restore a heritage building in George Town to be used as the PHT office. Ms Khoo Salma added that as yet, no heritage building has been identified – a visually prominent, historically significant building for long-term lease would be ideal. She appealed to members to help on this.

Dr Choong apologized for the delay in holding the AGM, explaining that last year had been very busy and fruitful for PHT. He encouraged members to read the thick annual report.

A Tourism Forum 2002 was announced by Mr Eddy Low, the chairman of this forum. It would be held on the 9th and 10th of October 2002 at the Wisma Masyarakat Penyayang. He invited PHT members to attend and to share their expert views.

2. Confirmation of the Minutes of the AGM 2001

It was pointed out that several names had been omitted from the list of those who attended the previous year's AGM. The names to be added to the attendance list are: Mrs Marlene Fox. Mr Robert Holland, Ms Oh Eng Sim and Ms Anna DW Tan.

There were no other amendments and the confirmation of the minutes was proposed by Mrs Marlene Fox and seconded by Mr Laurence Loh.

Ms Salma pointed out to members that the PHT membership is valid from January to December of each year, therefore membership expires by the end of the year, regardless of the month in which the subscription is renewed.

3. Presentation and Adoption of the PHT Annual Report 2002

Ms Khoo Salma highlighted the annual report. The membership has hit 500 and this is hoped that it will continue to increase for the coming year.

More funds were raised last year. The major grants were for the Penang Story Project. An Oral History workshop and four colloquiums were held, PHT co-organised with other groups; the Academy of Social Sciences, Malaysian Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry, Chinese Clans Association Youth committee and Penang Eurasian Association, leading to a final event, the Penang Story International Conference – a very successful and highly publicized event.

Under the UNESCO Participation Programme, a workshop 'Warisan Kita Di Tanjung' was organized to create awareness on Muslim heritage in George Town.

Cikgu Bahroodin was invited to introduce his Museum talks/performance to members.

Ms Loh-Lim reported that the Anak-Anak Kota project was a very successful programme funded by Ford Foundation and it is still an on-going project. Talks were given to the schools, children were introduced to traditional trades. Loh-Lim commented that children had been exposed to the inner city in a very enthusiastic way, she has re-applied to the Ford Foundation for funding for this year. She also announced that we would be given a donation of RM5,000 by pan Malaysian Pool under the Tanjung heritage 2002 Award for the endangered trades introduced by ArtsEd.

Ms Loh-Lim corrected a typing error on the list of school on page 26. In the talk on 10th April to Sekolah Padang Polo, the number of participants should read as 50 instead of 0.

Mr Laurence Loh corrected an error on page 28 – Suffolk House Restoration. Last sentence should read as 'The State government (not PHT) has yet to receive the funding from the Federal government under the 8th Malaysian Plan for Phase 2 restoration of Suffolk House.'

Ms Lim Gaik Siang reported on heritage alert. Instead of seeking to confront the MPPP, we are now seeking to engage and co-operate with the city councilors to resolve matters. Ms Lim requested members to report to PHT if they came upon any illegal demolition in the city.

Ms Khoo Salma called upon Zakaria Basheer, a descendant of Sheikh Omar Basheer, to brief the members on the Acheen Street alert. He explained that this is the oldest living Muslim settlement in the city and it is located near to Khoo Kongsi and Little India. PHT is concerned about the environmental impact as well as the cultural impact on the life of people in the area.

Mr Ahmad Chik reported that PHT has formed a coalition with other like-minded bodies to resolve urban blight issues. The proposals submitted and meetings with the city councilors to tackle the problems have resulted in marked improvements in a few areas.

Mrs Teresa Capol, who heads the PHT heritage trails and tours, said that there has been good response in the last year. Some income has been generated through this programme and she was hoping that more locals would be interested to join the tours. She said that the PATA Task Force who did a tourism assessment in Penang earlier this year emphasized that heritage and culture is the core attraction of tourism industry in Penang, as PHT has been saying all along.

PHT's exclusive site visits was one of the most successful programmes organised for members, Ms Loh-Lim announced. She was overwhelmed by the number of members attending the last site visit to Batu Ferringhi Aqueduct and Guillemard. She said that site visits also involved community participation. She called for suggestions of sites and invited members for feedback on areas of improvement.

Ms Salma said that the editorship of the PHT newsletter has been taken over by Ms Loh-Lim. Volunteers are needed to help revive the PHT website.

PHT suffered high staff turnover during the reporting period. Magdeline Ng who started work in mid-February, is running the office now.

Ms Salma voiced her dissatisfaction concerning heritage conservation in George Town, as more houses are in dilapidated state. She appealed to members to support efforts to safeguard heritage buildings. She said that the support from the government and private sectors is very important.

As there were no further questions, the annual report was adopted – Mr Pierre Laine proposed and Mrs Teresa Capol seconded.

4. Presentation of Honorary Treasurer's Report

Ms Catherine Loh presented the report. She informed members that the main income for PHT last year was from the fundraising dinner. Two-thirds of the fixed deposits are reserved as designated project funds. The project funds received mainly benefited the projects and the community. PHT only charges an administrative fee for projects in order to run the office, hence more funds are needed to cover the expenses.

It was resolved that Messrs UHY Diong be re-appointed as auditors for the ensuing year, the motion was proposed by Ms Lim Gaik Siang and seconded by Mr Teoh Poh Huat.

As there were no further questions, the treasurer's report was adopted by Mr Teoh Poh Huat as proposer and Mr Woo Yee Saik as seconder.

5. Mr Laurence Loh was invited to give a briefing on Badan Warisan Malaysia's recent fundraising dinner. As the vice-president of Badan Warisan, he reported that during the Badan Warisan Fundraising dinner, DPM Datuk Seri Ahmad Badawi said that the Town and Country Planning Act would be amended, and legislative guidelines would be formed to safeguard heritage buildings. The RM20 million heritage fund's announcement by YB Dato' Seri Ong Kah Ting would enhance the country's conservation programme, especially in Penang and Malacca.

6. Other Matters

Proposal by Mr R.K. Jones.

As the original proposer was absent, Mr Douglas Fox proposed that PHT should pass a resolution stating PHT's concern for impact the outer ring road would have on Gurney Drive. Mr Ahmad Chik supported this concern by briefing members on the history of Henry Gurney of Gurney Drive.

After some discussions, members decided that an amendment be made to Mr Jones's proposal; it should be read as –

'That Penang Heritage Trust recognizes that Gurney Drive is an essential component of Penang's heritage and strongly opposes any development which would interfere with the present sea-front and which may have an adverse impact on the historic port area of George Town.'

The amendment was proposed by Mrs Marlene Fox and seconded by Mr Pierre Laine. The resolution was unanimously agreed to by all.

As there were no other matters, the AGM adjourned at 5.00pm with a vote of thanks to the Chair. Dr Choong then invited members for tea before the walkabout along Armenian Street.



5. PHT Projects & Programmes

Shared Histories, Communities and Cultural Heritage in Southeast Asia's Western Littoral Conference (Sponsored by SEASREP)

The conference was conceived during The Penang Story – International Conference 2002, when it was realized Penang was a sub-regional centre for this area, but lost its significance after the creation of nation-state boundaries. This is the first time that scholars of Myanmar, Malaysia, Thailand and Indonesia met to discuss the socio-cultural history and cross-cultural links of Southeast Asia's Western Littoral. They were joined by



scholars and participants hailing from Japan, Singapore, Australia, Canada, the Netherlands, Germany and the United Kingdom.

The conference started with a welcome dinner and opening speech by Dato' Anwar Fazal and a book launch of 'Penang Postcard Collection' by Khoo Salma Nasution and Malcolm Wade. Participants were entertained by a performance by Cikgu Bahroodin and enjoyed the exclusive tours to Penang's Historic Port Settlement, Pulau Tikus Burmese and Thai Temples, and College Generale, Mariophile.

As in the Penang Story, the centrality of Penang in the region was very much promoted, tracing Penang's links to Aceh, Medan, Phuket and Rangoon. Senior professors and new scholars alike acknowledged that the history of Penang is very much under-investigated. In particular, Penang's historical role as an educational centre and the intellectual centre of this region's 'knowledge networks' deserves much greater attention.

A number of positive suggestions and proposals arose at the end of the conference. First, that the region could be alternatively called Southeast Asia's Indian Ocean



Littoral. Secondly, that publications on the commercial historical links between Penang and Phuket and a bio graphical dictionary of Chinese in the region should be

produced. Third, that the next Shared Histories Conference should be held in Myanmar. Fourth, that Acheen Street should be further researched and converted into a Hajj Museum, commemorating the experience of thousands of pilgrims who embarked for Makkah from Penang during the age of sea travel.

The Shared Histories Conference was sponsored by SEASREP, the Southeast Asian Studies Regional Exchange Programme, which aims to promote Southeast Asian Studies in Southeast Asia. The programme is jointly funded by the Toyota Foundation and the Japan Foundation Asia Centre. A big thank you to all the speakers, participants, staff and volunteers who made this event a success.

Heritage Education programme 'Anak-anak Kota'

The 2002 to 2003 programme continued its earlier phase with further talks in schools followed by inner city workshops during the school holidays.

Three different workshops were run:-

- 1. The Architectural Workshop where facilitators worked with children, identifying different styles of buildings and varying details. They focussed on roofing, facades, fenestration, materials and also looked at 'appropriate' and 'inappropriate' elements and changes and why these were so. The children then produced a pamphlet for various types of houses
- 2. The Traditional Foods Workshop. Children identified 5 traditional foods and set about to spend some time with the traders to learn and to document recipes, ingredients and styles of preparation. Brochures are being produced

 The Endangered Trades Workshop. Again, the children conducted informal apprenticeship with the traders and documented processes

and materials, brochures are being produced.

A video is in its final stages of preparation and this will collate all the work that has been done in the heritage education programme. A website is also being set up. Besides working with children, the movement to disseminate information as part of the general 'raising of consciousness' about conservation, has been brought to colleges, universities, other NGOs and professional organisations. These have included talks and slide shows and as well as heritage walkabouts in the inner city.

Urban Blight & Beach Street Revitalization

The PHT-led, urban blight awareness campaign has resulted in the Beach Street Revitalization project. The latter seeks to redress many of the problems identified such as pedestrian-unfriendly walkways, bad signage, pavements in disrepair, uncoordinated utilities etc. The project commenced in July 2003 and should be completed by late November 2003.

World Monument Funds

The funds (US\$80,000) from the World Monument Fund is still pending as PHT has yet to identify a significant building in the inner city, which is in need of restoration, with suitable conditions attached. We are hoping to obtain a long lease from the owner so that the restored building can be used as the PHT office and community space. Over the last year, we have viewed over two dozen buildings and have finally come upon what looks like a suitable choice – to be announced.

Heritage Community Revitalisation through Women and Youth - Warisan Kita Di Tanjung

This two-year project, supported by CIDA Women's Initiative Fund, ended in February 2003. Several events and activities were organised for women in Lebuh Acheh. The objective was to mobilize the women's group and to upgrade their skills, so that they are more united and more vocal to liaise with the authorities to save this last intact urban Malay settlement in George Town. Talks on Waqf, Haj pilgrimage in Acheen Street were coordinated by Zakiah Basheer and attended by the Lebuh Acheh community. The women learned computer skills, attended Arabic and English classes, and were brought together through curtain sewing and baking classes. PHT had printed out Hari Raya Greeting cards, designed by Zakaria Basheer, as a nationwide campaign to save Lebuh Acheh.

Women in Urban Governance & Urban Revitalization

This is a follow-up project of 'Heritage Community Revitalisation through Women and Youth – Warisan Kita Di Tanjung', extending the programme to women from all cultural backgrounds, with a focus on inner city women. The main objectives of this project, again supported by the CIDA Women's Initiative Fund, are to strengthen networking among inner city women to expand the network of support services relevant to them; and, to work with various community groups to strengthen their roles as agents of change in their heritage and historic environment of George Town, which is being nominated for World Heritage

status. Between May and July, besides small meetings with various groups, two talks and a workshop were organized.

A Syariah Talk on 'Emergence of Waqf Land in Penang and the Possible Role of Beneficiary to Administer Them', a proposal has been suggested at the end, which is to form Waqf Watch, to administer the Waqf land in Penang.

The talk on 'Accessibility, Legislation and Its Implementation on Building Requirements for Disabled Persons' was attended by over 40 persons from organisations like Disabled Society, Cheshire Home, Women Centre for Change, Spastic Association, University Sains Malaysia and city councilor. Several meetings were held with representatives of the Society of Disabled Persons, Penang to discuss issues like access to housing and heritage sites.





The Single-Mothers' Motivational Workshop brought together 60 low-income single mothers. Most of these women were Malay/Muslim women from George Town. The workshop covered talks on heritage, housing conditions and the urban environment, skills training and a talk on avenues for micro-financing.

<u>Community Directory.</u> A draft Community Directory is at the planning and compiling stage, the scope includes but is not limited to civic, health, charity, community services, cultural, welfare, business opportunities for women, and hotlines.



Treasurer's Report for the Year 2002

Members with long memories may recall that the 2001 Treasurer's Report ended with a note of warning. Unhappily the warning has been proven to be only too accurate.

The income for 2002 was RM70,464 (in 2001 it was RM96,845), whereas the corresponding expenditure was RM90,361 (RM88,448), with the result that the PHT incurred a deficit of RM19,857. This compares unfavourably with 2001 when we had a surplus of RM8,397.

This is worrying development which has to be addressed as quickly as possible.

Comparing the 2002 figures with those of the previous year several salient points become evident:

- i) In 2001 the Trust received RM49,209 as income from a dinner and silent auction. There was no such income in 2002.
- ii) AGM and Council Meeting Expenses doubled to RM6,390 in 2002.
- iii) Salaries and related staff expenses declined by about 12% in 2002.
- iv) The cost of printing the newsletter jumped from zero to RM10,406.
- v) Income from entrance fees and subscription increased marginally (RM20,207 v RM19,173).

As usual, the staff costs form the largest percentage (46%) of our expenses. The other major cost items were printing of newsletter (11%); office rental (9%); AGM and council meeting expenses (7%).

On the whole our financial position has deteriorated and is likely to continue into the near future unless serious efforts are made to arrest the trend. Your Council needs help with this matter. Members who are in a position to help with fund raising are requested to contact the Treasurer or any Council member.

As an immediate measure, we have been trying to increase the income from sales of merchandise and to obtain sponsors of the newsletter, but, so far, with singular lack of success. If any member wishes to sponsor single issues or even a series of newsletter (or have the knowledge of anyone or corporation who may wish to do so) please get in touch with the office.
